
INSTRUCTIONS

DIAGRAM 1

The grooves in the bamboo is where you will slide the bottom of the SEAT. These grooves need to be on the inside of the SEAT.









WHERE TO START?


- 1. In your SEAT pack you should have an unassembled SEAT. The first thing to do is count out the pieces and lay them out as in Diagram 1.
- 4 arched side pieces
- 4 legs
- A thin base
- A top
- 16 bamboo dowels
- A hammer
- A long bamboo dowel for disassembly (not pictured)
- 2. Assemble the pieces 1,2 and 3 together by sliding into the slots. Make sure the thin groove is on the inside.
- 3. Slide piece number 4, the thin base, along the groove and into place. This has to be in completely for the next piece to go on. Then take piece 5 and slide it in place to complete the box.
- 4. Now take the legs and line up the 4 holes, making sure that it is flat across the top. A trick is to hammer 2 dowels only half way which helps you to line it all up.
- 5. Using the hammer, insert the dowels into the holes. Make sure the holes line up and the leg and the side sit flat across the top. Turn over for more tips and hints.
- 6. Now you can put SEAT's lid on. Line up the keyholes on the underside and then twist it on.
- 7. Once SEAT is assembled, paint or decorate it however you like. Log onto www.seatproject.org for more ideas and information.





TIPS & HINTS



When attaching the legs, make sure that each leg is aligned with the side. Another tip is to hammer 2 dowels (instead of 4) only halfway in on each leg first to really help you line up the holes.



Twist the lid on and off to reveal SEAT's secret compartment!

Each SEAT is hand made in Vietnam so often needs to be worked to get everything lined up right.
